This week you can use paper (or even junk mail) to create beautiful weaving. All you'll need for this week's project is paper &amp; scissors!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Begin by creating your loom. Junk mail, cereal boxes or magazines are great options</li> <li>b. Cut additional paper into strips and begin to weave (over, under, then under, over)</li> <li>c.
